Relationship Rebuild

As we head into the holiday season, a time for reflection and renewal, I'm excited to launch a series on **Relationship Rebuild**. Let's explore the essential elements of strong, healthy relationships:

- 1. **The Wisdom of Boundaries:** "Do not be yoked together with unbelievers. For what do righteousness and wickedness have in common? Or what fellowship can light have with darkness?" (2 Corinthians 6:14). Setting healthy limits can protect our relationships and promote mutual respect.
- 2. **The Risk of Love:** "Love bears all things, believes all things, hopes all things, endures all things" (1 Corinthians 13:7). Vulnerability is the cornerstone of authentic relationships. By sharing our true selves, we deepen our bonds.
- 3. **The Magic of Empathy:** "Rejoice with those who rejoice, weep with those who weep" (Romans 12:15). Understanding and sharing the feelings of others creates empathy, which strengthens our connections.
- 4. **The Courage to Confront:** "Faithful are the wounds of a friend; profuse are the kisses of an enemy" (Proverbs 7:6). Addressing issues with honesty and love can lead to deeper understanding and resolution.
- 5. **The Art of Forgiveness:** "Forgive us our debts, as we also have forgiven our debtors" (Matthew 6:12). Letting go of resentment and embracing understanding is key to healing and growth.
- 6. **The Power of Encouragement:** "Encourage one another and build each other up" (1 Thessalonians 5:11). Positive words and actions can uplift and inspire those around us, fostering deeper connections.

Human beings are inherently relational. Our problems, at their core, are often relationship problems. Let's invest in our relationships and build the skills to flourish.

... Committee Reports ...

Building & Grounds

The following projects have been addressed, and are either pending, in progress, or been completed:

- 1. Boxwood bushes replacement completed.
- 2. Church roof replacement completed.
- 3. Repair of concrete on the outside ramp completed.
- 4. Broken window above the entrance doors at the Ministry Center will be replaced by Freeburg Glass. Estimated cost \$1,800.
- 5. Floor squeaking, moving at the sanctuary entrance. Pending.
- 6. Dandy Lawn treated weeds and aerated/overseeded the church property for \$465.
- 7. Clean the concrete seams and install SL1 to prevent weeds around the church entrance. Pending.
- 8. Food & Clothing Bank parking lot needs resealed in 2025. Two bids were received: \$3,000 Sonnenberg and \$2,250 Rooters. F&C Board may help pay for this project.
- 9. List of possible end of the year projects:
 - Replace the lower level of the breezeway floor.
 - Replace parsonage driveway. Estimated cost \$5,500.
 - Install radon system in the Parsonage. Estimated cost \$1,500.
